

# **SCHOOL ENROLMENT ZONE**



From term 3 our Enrolment Zone will be in place. This means students who <u>are not currently enrolled</u> and are outside of the pink zone will need to apply for a place through the ballot system.

If you have a child turning 5 next year and you currently live outside of the zone, please submit your enrolment before 15 October 2024. The ballot will then be drawn on 23 October and families will be notified of the status of their 'out of zone' enrolment by 30 October. Children who are unsuccessful will be placed on a waitlist. If places are available or become available in 2025, additional ballots may be held. These dates will be notified in the first instance through local social media, the school Facebook and website and the school newsletter.

This is a very new situation for us and we will be monitoring our roll growth carefully to ensure we are able to maintain our smaller class sizes.

At our most recent Board meeting we confirmed our Analysis of Variance document for 2023. This is an important reporting document for our community where we review our results against our goals set out in our strategic plan. This is now published on our website.

While we are still pushing forward to our overall goal of 70% of students at or above across the key curriculum areas of Reading, Writing and Maths, there were some areas of success we want to celebrate. Kauri Team (our year 7 and 8s) made significant gains throughout the year and 77% of year 8 students graduated At or Above expectation in Reading. In year 6, there was a 20% improvement in students At or Above expectation again in Reading.

To reach our goal, we need our whole community to support us. Whānau engagement with student learning is key.

With that in mind, a key strategy introduced this year to help us achieve this goal is the Focus Student Whanau Hui. It was great to see so many whānau at this first hui as we know that greater whanau engagement leads to improved learning outcomes for students.

We also have our goal of 90% whānau attendance at Parent Interviews.

Together we can make this happen!


